2014 sees federal budget approved, and up tick in funding for behavioral health

Good funding news welcomed after years of recession and sequester cuts

Last year there was no <u>federal</u> budget enacted and gridlock was the order of the day. But fiscal year 2014 is different: negotiations over the holidays resulted in a \$1.1 trillion spending bill, signed by President Obama on January 17 that funds Integris to open mental health unit in response to closure at the Deaconess location in Bethany Integris Health plans to open a mental health unit in its southwest Oklahoma City medical center in June to replace some of the inpatient psychiatric services being cut by a competing hospital.

Best of all, no power cord is required.



FY2014 funding for SAMHSA expands vital mental health services – especially for children

As a result of the Fiscal Year 2014 "Consolidated Appropriations Act" (P.L. 113-76), the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), will provide expanded help to meet the mental health needs of individuals, families and communities across the nation. The \$276 million additional funding above the FY13 postsequestration level will enable SAMHSA to better address the mental health needs of the nation's children and young people – including those most at risk for serious mental illnesses.
