BY OUTFITTING POLICE WITH TELEHEALTH IPADS, MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM SAVES GOVERNMENT \$62M

Through a partnership with the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, HunterCare is deploying telehealth technology to all Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics in Oklahoma. Under a funding mandate from Oklahoma Senate Bill 7, the state's Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse distributed more than 30,000 iPads statewide from the MyCare Technologies, the behavioral health division of HunterCare, as a mental health resource. One key component to this new initiative: Law enforcement officials often face challenges transporting individuals in mental health crises to the nearest facility for assessment. So the legislative funding facilitated the provision of MyCare iPads to Oklahoma police as well as Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics. The results have been encouraging. Since beginning the iPad program, there has been a 93.1% reduction in inpatient hospitalizations for mental health crises from 2015 – 2021, resulting in cost savings of more than \$62 million to federal and state governments.

OhioMHAS Unveils New Branding for State's Behavioral Health Care Hospitals

The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (OhioMHAS) announced that it is rebranding its hospital system, signaling a new chapter for Ohio's six, state-run regional behavioral health care hospitals. In addition to promoting a cohesive look and feel with unified hospital names and logos, the move is intended to increase public understanding of the services provided at the facilities and to further reduce the stigma often surrounding serious mental illness.

OhioMHAS currently operates six regional psychiatric hospitals, with locations in Athens, Cincinnati, Columbus, Massillon, Northfield, and Toledo. As part of the rebranding effort, all six will receive updated logos. In addition to each hospital's name, the new logos will also identify the facilities as part of OhioMHAS. The addition of the "Heart of Hope" tagline to each, is symbolic of the high-quality, person-centered health care system that provides healing and hope to patients and their families.
